Founded in 1460, the oldest university in Switzerland is noticeably enhancing the dialogue between life sciences and culture, two areas on which they have decided to focus on for the last several years. Regard- ing the life science domain, Basel has been providing biocenters and molecular biology research centers for more than 30 years. It is the only university in Switzerland which offers a Master of Nanosciences. The creation of a gender study center and the new study course of Media and Com- munication Sciences underline the impor- tance of university's contribution to human sciences. Number of Nobel Laureates: 1		Switzerland's Capital University is a public institution with roots going back to the 16th century. The 8 faculties offer a wide range of BA, MA and PhD programs. The study environment and the quality of life in Bern are of very high quality and thanks to the relatively small size of the university, the ambience is friendly and personal. Bern is internationally renowned for its outstanding climate and astrophysics research to name just a couple. The 140 institutes are located within walking distance of the main building, overlooking the Jungfrau Mountain region – the Top of Europe - and the old town, a UNESCO world heritage site. The city of Berne itself is embedded in a beautiful natural environment with rolling hills, woods, lakes and mountains.		Fribourg is the only bilingual university (French - German) in Switzerland and has a strong international tradition. It offers a wide range of different complete formations (BA, MA, and Doctorate) in both languages and confers bilingual degrees in certain branches. Some classes are also taught in English. There are five faculties composed of department and institutes with interdisci- plinary research and teaching units. It offers various programs in different fields, namely Federalism, European Law, Building Lease, Ethics and Human Rights. In its Charter, the university emphasizes to quality of edu- cation, responsibility and fostering dialogue. A particular focus is placed on the contact between students and teachers. About one quarter of the 37'000 inhabitants of Fri- bourg are students.		Founded in 1559, the University of Geneva defines itself as a place of reflection, teach- ing and dialogue. With its 14'685 students from 137 different nations, this alma mater is the second largest university after Zurich, with the largest number of women students in the country. The University of Geneva has a strong international reputation. It is a comprehensive university: it teaches most of the existing fields in Sciences, Medicine, Arts, Economics and Social Sciences. Its domains of excellence in research include life sciences (molecular biology, bio- informatics), physics of elementary particles and astrophysics. Furthermore, Geneva has the only School of Translation and In- terpretation (ETI) in Switzerland.

Founded in 1537, and based on Human Sciences (Social Sciences and Politics, Literature, Theology, Commerce) and the Life Sciences (Biology and Medicine), the University of Lausanne continues with its humanistic tradition. It focuses on man and the living in the natural and social environ- ment. Prominent is its faculty of geo- sciences and environment as well as its school of criminal sciences, incorporated into the Faculty of Law. Giving a particular importance to the training and research, the University of Lausanne offers its students a solid foundation in order to become an in- tellectual and innovative force for the future society. Number of Nobel Laureates: 5	The University of Lucerne counted 262 students in 2000, the year of its foundation. Four years later, it already had 900 and in 2006, it expects to host 1700 students. For this young university it is an important ob- jective to stand out in the Swiss landscape of higher education. In order to achieve this goal, the Faculty of Law has decided to set its focus on three domains: Fundamental Rights, Commercial Law and Cultural Law. The Faculty of Human Sciences proposes studies in Religious Sciences and Jewish Studies, Communication Sciences, or Cul- tural Sciences. The Theological Studies specialize in ethics and inter-religious dis- course.	Located centrally in the region of the watch- making and microtechnology industries, the University of Neuchâtel stands out due to its ideal study and research location, its privileged framework and its convivial am- bience. The University of Neuchâtel pro- poses the following specific formations: work psychology, museology, microtech- nology, journalism and communication, logopedics, prehistoric archaeology, and ethnology. It also offers two masters taught in English: the Master of Science in Micro- and Nanotechnology and the Master of Sci- ence in Physics. Some other masters are offered partially in English.	The University of St. Gallen currently houses the largest faculty of higher educa- tion in commerce in Switzerland. The whole structure of its studies is based on three pillars: contact studies (lecture, seminars, exercises), independent studies (studying by e-learning, projects with tutors), and contextual studies (development of per- sonal and negotiation skills). At the bache- lor's level, five degree programs are of- fered: Business Administration, Economics, International Affairs, Law and Economics and Law. At the master's level ten different programs are available, two of which are taught in English. Research-oriented Ph.D's round out the study opportunities.

Founded in 1996, the USI is the only university with courses taught in Italian outside of Italy. It has four faculties based on research and practice: architecture, economics, communication sciences and informatics. The USI counts 1800 students of 30 nationalities, 150 professors, 200 assistants and researchers and 80 associates for administrative and technical matters. It is one of the first Swiss Universities to have adopted the European Bologna Model. The direct link between the students and the professors, a true interdisciplinary approach, in addition to a modern infrastructure on the Campuses of Lugano and Mendrisio distinguish this university from others.	With more than 23000 students, the University of Zurich is the largest university in Switzerland. It is a research university at the international level. It collaborates tightly with the neighboring ETHZ in seven com- mon centers of competences. The two schools are jointly offering the largest train- ing in the country in the field of life sci- ences. The university attaches a particular impor- tance to following collaborative projects: "Vetsuisse" which aims to create a general faculty for veterinary medicine with the Uni- versity of Berne; the trans-regional collabo- ration Constance-Zurich in the domain of research concerning membrane biology; and the "Public Health" network, which aims to strengthen medical training all over Swit- zerland.
